

The Williamsburg Bridge: An Account of the Ceremonies Attending the Formal Opening of the Structure, December the Nineteenth, MDCCCCIII Together with an Illustrated Historical and Descriptive Sketch of the Enterprise. Brooklyn: Eagle Press,1903. Ceremonies and parades on the December day marking the opening of the bridge, the world's longest suspension bridge and the second across the East River. Designed for tram and rail lines as well as pedestrians and bicyclists, the bridge was opposed by the ferry interests and by anyone else who didn't have a piece of it. Chief Engineer Leffert L. Buck was responsible for the somewhat controversial design, and grander approaches on both sides were constructed. With photographs documenting construction, and a necrology.
